A home school agreement is an important part of schooling. It sets out expectations and responsibilities of the school, family and children. The law requires governing bodies to have a homeschool agreement.

Our behaviour policy is founded on four key rules prominently displayed around the school.

- Always walk when moving around school.

The basic principle which all persons in school are expected to observe is that we avoid saying or doing anything that might offend, upset or injure other people.
