

Social Media

Net Aware can be accessed online or is available as a mobile phone app.

It has been developed by the NSPCC and O2, it is a guide on the interactive social networks, apps or games that children use the most (based on research with over 500 parents and carers and 1,725 young people.)

Net aware helps parents (primarily of 8-12 year olds) to understand more about the different sites and apps, it also gives advice from other parents about age appropriateness, content, ease of reporting and privacy.





CEOP Report

Button

- •Talk with your child / children
- Have privacy controls/ filters on Internet and individual apps
- •Talk to a member of staff at school if you have concerns or need advice
- •Know what your child is doing on the Internet
- •Check out apps yourself before allowing your child to use them
- •Have set 'home' boundaries i.e.. What they can do and when on the Internet

•Ask your child about Online safety (they may surprise you and know more than you think!)

Terminology explained:

Sexting - when someone shares sexual, naked or semi-naked images or videos of themselves or others, or sends sexually explicit messages.

Grooming - Grooming is when someone builds an emotional connection with a child to gain their trust for the purposes of sexual abuse, sexual exploitation or trafficking.

Age appropriate - Something that is age-appropriate is suitable for the age that a person is.

PEGI rating - Pan European Game Information is a European video game content rating system established to help European consumers make informed decisions on buying computer games with logos on games' boxes.

Social media: A term used to describe a variety of Web-based platforms, applications and technologies that enable people to socially interact with one another online.

Chat room / forums- an area on the Internet or other computer network where users can communicate, typically one dedicated to a particular topic.

Blog - usually written by one user and usually only allows for the responses of others to the blog material.
